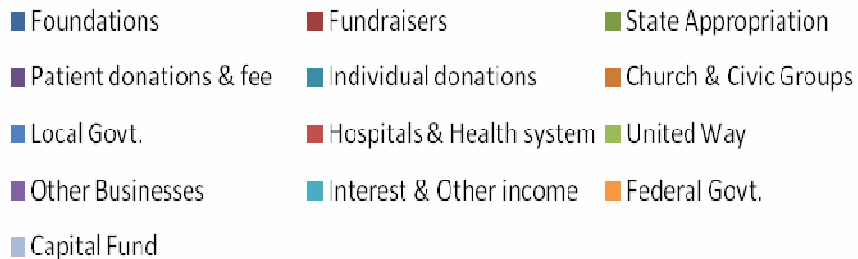
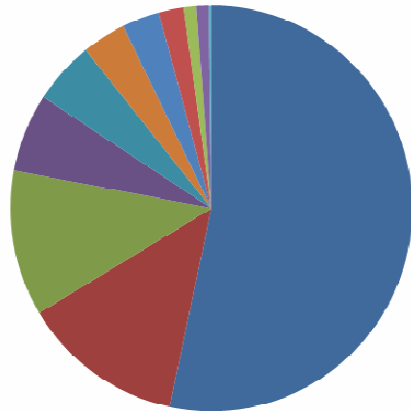


Our Funding

Our History

In 1997, during a discussion among members of the Abingdon Episcopal Church Outreach Committee, an idea was born to build a medical clinic to serve people without health insurance in Gloucester and Mathews Counties. Fueled by the drive to provide quality health care to the uninsured, enthusiasm for the project spread through the church and into the community at large.

The initial supporters soon kicked off a campaign to raise \$74,000 to establish the Clinic and cover its expenses through the first year of operation. The fundraising goal was reached in March 1998, with help from Riverside Walter Reed Hospital donating the use of their former satellite facility in Hayes.

The Gloucester-Mathews Free Clinic held its first open house in the summer of 1998.

Today, the Clinic is part of the Greater Virginia Peninsula Consortium of Free Clinics and serving more patients each year. In 2011, the clinic provided more than 27,492 worth of prescriptions and recorded more than 5,500 patient visits.

The Clinic opened its Administrative Office on Gloucester's Main Street in 2009. Clients are screened out of this location for their eligibility.

GMFC is currently in the process of exploring a new location to serve as both a clinic and an administrative office. It is our hope to provide a more central location for all our patients.
